


## Wild Worship



Four Outdoor Walks with Worship marking the turning of the seasons – organised by the local Methodist churches - open to all.

## **Autumn: Friday 29th September 2023**

The Idea: This short walk along the Afon Wygyr to the sea, will be led by John Hay and Nick Sissons. There will be moments of prayerful reflection focusing on the environment and climate change using material from the Season of Creation whose theme is God's River of Justice & Peace.

Meeting time: 10.00am Depart: promptly at 10.15am Finish: around 12.15pm

**Departure Location:** We will assemble in the parking area outside Cemaes Football ground LL67 0LB. Turn down the lane off Ffordd Y Felin past Ysgol Gynradd Cemaes and carry straight on for about 50m. Park in the large open area by the football pitch.

Walking distance: This gentle walk is just over a mile in total. There is an option for any who wish to extend the walk by another mile and a half as described below.

Walking time: With pauses for reflection the walk will last no more than 2 hours

**Terrain:** Two grass fields then firm flat tracks or concrete paths. No road sections or high steps. If it has rained there will be lots of deep wet grass to walk through. The fields have dips that can be hard to spot so a walking pole would be advisable.

Kit: Good footwear with ankle support and full length trousers.

For those less mobile: Anyone not wishing to do the walk could meet us at Maes Parcio Traeth Mawr (Big Beach Car Park, Cemaes) for the final reflection by the Time & Tide Bell at around 11.00. There is a parking fee of £4.

Afterwards: People can choose to walk straight back along the paths/fields to the cars or go for a coffee in the High Street and return by the roads. For those who wish a longer walk, after a quick coffee at the beach café Nick is happy to continue to Eglwys LLandbadrig along the coastal path (30 mins) or by the country lanes (20 mins).
